REPORT FROM THE CHIEF OF POLICE

Chief Beck commented that the May Day event that occurred on May 1, 2017, was a well-policed event, well-behaved crowd of approximately 15,000 people. He was pleased with how things transpired.

Last week Chief Beck attended the City Budget hearings on the Department budget. MTA contract for Police Service and funds for the community surveys were included in the budget. The Department received funding for cash overtime. The Department did not get funding for continuation of contracts that may impact TEAMS II. The Department will continue to seek other funds to cover the costs.

An Officer-Involved Shooting (OIS) occurred on April 22, about 6:30 a.m. at the Mission Area. Mission Area received a radio call of an assault with deadly weapon suspect. The patrol unit arrived and encountered the individual described in the radio call in North Hills. Caller stated suspect was armed with a knife and a gun. Officers engaged in verbalization to less-lethal and tried to establish rapport. Eventually, Suspect drew and pointed his gun at the officers prompting an OIS. He was severely injured. A replica firearm was recovered as well as a knife. The original 911 call came from the suspect's cell phone. He called the police and described himself.
