REPORT OF THE CHIEF OF POLICE

Chief Beck reached out to NYPD Chief of Police James O'Neill to express condolences for the tragic assassination of Officer Familia. Officer Familia was a single mother of three children and there is nothing more tragic than this loss.

On June 28, 2017, an Officer-Involved-Shooting (OIS) occurred in Rampart Area. Gang Enforcement Detail Officers came in contact with a known gang member. The suspect removed a semi-automatic gun from his backpack. A bean-bag shotgun initially was used to de-escalate the situation but was ineffective. The suspect pointed a hand-gun towards the officers and an OIS occurred. Fire department responded and tried to render aid, but the suspect was pronounced dead at the scene. A Force Investigation has been initiated.

On June 29, 2017, an OIS occurred in Hawthorne during a homicide investigation that originated in Southwest Division. During a surveillance of one of the suspects, a pursuit began and ended at Aviation Blvd., in the city of Hawthorne. The suspect exited the vehicle and fled into an apartment complex. Uniformed SWAT, Hawthorne police and LAPD detectives converged to the apartment complex, and the suspect fired multiple rounds from a semi-automatic hand-gun at pursuing officers which resulted in an OIS. Suspect was wounded and an officer was shot in the hip and is recovering from the wound.
