REPORT OF THE CHIEF OF POLICE

Chief Moore expressed condolences from the Department and the Police Commission for the officers and protestor killed during the Charlottesville incident. The Department reacted to a couple protests in the City in response to the incidents. Key to success will be ability to garner support of protestors by

ensuring their safety. Police and Fire Games concludes on Wednesday at LA Convention Center. Chief Moore expressed thanks to all the city partners that supported the Games. Los Angeles County Sheriff's Reserve Officer, Jacob Castro, passed as a result of an accident that occurred during an off-road cycling accident.

Today was the first day of school for the LA Unified School District and many of the officers were at schools. The Department will continue to add patrols to ensure safety of youngsters as they begin their new school year.

An OIS occurred on August 9, 2017, a radio call in the West LA Patrol Division. Officers responded to a domestic violence radio call about a suspect armed with a shotgun and two hand guns. The suspect fired shots at a female in the residence approximately 20 minutes prior to the radio call. The caller was a security guard who was standing with the victim of the residence. The suspect was intoxicated and had battered the victim. Officers deployed around the residence and the suspect barricaded himself refusing to come out. SWAT was called in. As SWAT was relieving patrol officers, the suspect fired multiple rounds at SWAT personnel resulting in an officer-involved shooting. Suspect returned into the residence SWAT entered the and placed the suspect in custody. The Fire Dept. paramedics determined the suspect was deceased as a result of the OIS. No officers were injured. Three hand guns and a shot gun were recovered. Use of Force initiated an investigation.
