Crime Trends and Locations: During this past month, Basic Car 17A23's issues were Burglary/Theft from Motor Vehicle (B/TFMV). The areas of concern were from Rinaldi Street to Chatsworth Street and Tampa Avenue to De Soto Avenue. Items that were the primary target were GPS, MP3/iPod, computers, and third-row seats from SUV-type vehicles. **Please remember to report all suspicious criminal activity!!!**

Crime Tip/Prevention:
For owners of SUV-type vehicles, we would like to ask that you secure the third row seat with a cable/chain and lock. When parking your SUV, try to back the rear of the vehicle against a wall, garage, or area that would prevent the rear lift door from opening. **Most importantly, remove all valuable property from your vehicles.**

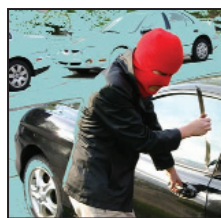

Crime Trends and Locations:
The Basic Car area is looking fair, with no distinct clusters in any of the Reporting Districts (RDs). Please continue to use caution with regard to Burglary/Theft from Motor Vehicle (B/TFMV) activities that occur periodically in the areas of O'Melveny Park (RD 1705), the L.A. Fitness parking lot at Devonshire Street and Reseda Boulevard (RD 1743), and the residential area near Petit Park (RD 1737). The most common items taken are unattended purses being left in plain sight inside of parked vehicles.

Crime Trends and Locations:
From December 12, 2011, to January 7, 2012, there were two Robberies (211), four Assault with a Deadly Weapon (ADW), 23 Burglaries (459), nine Grand Theft Autos (GTA) and 24 Burglary/Theft from Motor Vehicles (B/TFMV). The number of crimes in 17A49's area has decreased from last month. The majority of our crimes this month occurred between midnight and six in the morning. Money and jewelry are the most common items being taken.

Crime Trends: Burglary/Theft from Motor Vehicles (B/TFMV) was our largest number of crimes for this last month. **When you park the car, please remember to bring all of your personal items, as well as your GPS, inside. It only takes a few seconds for a criminal to break your window and steal your property.**

Crime Tips:

Did you know there were many laws that came into effect as of January 2012? One of these laws is for child safety seats. This new law states **"children are to be in either a safety seat or booster seat until the age of eight, or until they reach a height of 4-feet 9-inches".** **The law also requires children who do not meet the above age or height requirement to ride in the rear seat of the vehicle. Following this new law may save your child's life in a car accident.** Please let your family and friends with kids know about this change.

Crime Trends and Locations:

As we begin 2012, I would like to remind everyone that, with your help, we **can** impact crime in the community. The area of concern is the **"Reseda corridor"** between Lassen Street and Roscoe Blvd. Crimes in this area include Vandalisms, Thefts, Burglaries and Burglary/Theft from Motor Vehicles (B/TFMV). **Even though the holiday season is over, it is still important for us to remember not to leave our valuables in plain sight in the passenger compartment of our vehicles where a potential suspect can see them.**

Crime Tip: Become more involved in your community! Help reduce crime and improve quality issues by communicating with your neighbors and attending Basic Car meetings. You never know - your neighbor may have the same concerns as you do and be reluctant to voice those concerns. **Your input is crucial in reducing crime and making the community you live in a safer place.**

Commendable Citizen and Officer Incidents:

Patrol officers observed a vehicle driving in the center median. They conducted a traffic stop and noticed an ID card and wallet on the passenger seat of the vehicle that obviously did not belong to the driver. Upon further investigation, officers found the owner of the ID card and wallet was a victim of a theft at the 24-Hour Fitness Club. He had reported his wallet and ID had been stolen from the men's locker room. All property was returned to the victim and the suspect was booked for commercial burglary! Due to the keen observation skills of officers and the immediate reporting of the crime by the victim, we were able to quickly apprehend the suspect and put the victim's mind at ease by returning all of his property. **Fantastic Police Work!**

Crime Trends and Locations: Residential Burglaries within Basic Car 17A81 during the period of December 4, 2011, and December 31, 2011, showed 12 Residential Burglaries. This was a decrease from last reporting period. Reporting Districts (RDs) 1762, 1764, 1771, 1781, 1782 and 1791 each had 2.

Burglary/Theft from Motor Vehicle (B/TFMV) showed we had 13. RD's 1662, 1771, & 1781 each had 1, RD 1764, 1772 each had 2, and RD 1791 had four.
